This course will explore key events, ideas, and people in U.S. History from Early Exploration to our Civil War's Reconstruction. It requires an active, thoughtful, and analytical mind. It is going to be a really fun class learning about an integral part of our nation's history.

Attendance:

Attendance is a very important aspect of this class. The program is specifically designed to take you on a journey of understanding. When you miss a class, you miss part of the "plot". Imagine missing 30 minutes in the middle of the best movie you have ever been to. It can wreck the experience and leave you confused. Much of this journey requires you to be here for the discussion and is difficult to "make up". If you are absent it is your responsibility to catch up with class notes and reading. You

may get notes from classmates, but the reading needs to be done on your own time. All handouts or homework assignments you missed will be in the folder on the back of the door labeled "History". It is your responsibility to obtain the work. You will be given one day for each day absent to make up missing work.

Assessment:

How will I be graded? You're graded on assessments, homework, and participation in class. You will earn points for each based on the importance of the material to be mastered. Your grade will be determined by using the grading scale listed below as well as what each grade is at that percentage.

Assessments: These are your tests, quizzes, and projects.. Oftentimes tests and quizzes are short answers as well as writing. Spelling and grammar will be part of the grade. Projects are seen in many formats. These will have high expectations.

Homework: You are expected to turn them in on time. You will lose one point per day if the assignment is late. If your name is not on it when it is turned in it still counts as late. Notes do count as homework assignments. There will be note checks throughout the year.

Participation: You will get a weekly participation grade. You are expected to do what is asked of you in class. This includes answering questions, working during work time, following class rules etc. You should consider yourself part of our team. It is important for you to actively participate in class to help yourself and others learn the material. If you have questions, speak up! Chances are if you are confused about something someone else is too. Mistakes will happen; it is through mistakes we learn.

You will be assigned so many participation points a day. If you lose them there is no way to get them back for that day. If what caused you to lose those points continues, a disciplinary action may be taken.

Re-Do Work / Extra Credit: You can fix any homework and tests and re-turn them in for half credit. There will be extra credit opportunities on most homework assignments; take advantage of them!

TIPS FOR SUCCESS!

- 1. Use Your Planner!! Even if we don't have homework, write down what was done in class. This will help you stay caught up on assignments and will help you understand "where we are".
